EpiWatch's FDA-cleared technology uses Apple Watch to continuously monitor for the detection of tonic-clonic seizures and alerts designated caregivers when a seizure is detected.

Through CTIP, EpiWatch will gain access to pediatric clinical and commercialization expertise, strategic guidance, networking opportunities, and potential direct and indirect financial support as it continues to grow and expand usage.

The collaboration will also support EpiWatch's broader work around the transition toward independence and transitions in epilepsy care, including opportunities to strengthen seizure action plans, caregiver communication, rescue therapy readiness, and continuity as adolescents transition from pediatric to adult care.
